Background

The Knight Hacks hackathon is a 36-hour event hosted by Knight Hacks, a welcoming technology community at UCF. A hackathon is best described as an invention marathon where students interested in technology come together to learn from peers and industry mentors, develop their skills, and create. Students work around-the-clock in teams of up to four to develop a project before the end of the weekend. The environment of a hackathon is overwhelmingly positive, supportive, and educational. It's not just senior-level computer science majors in attendance — Knight Hacks welcomes students of all backgrounds, skill levels, and academic majors. Most importantly, Knight Hacks is free of charge for students to attend!

Knight Hacks' core mission is to create a diverse, welcoming, and inclusive tech community. **As a 501(c)** (3) non-profit, student-led organization, we focus on student development. Sponsorship Tier Details

Knight Hacks 2025 will be physically taking place at the **University of Central Florida**. Below are some details of the perks offered above:

Note: All packages are completely negotiable. If there are any price adjustments or additional features you would like to request, please reach out to us! We will gladly work with you to achieve the best package!

Career Fair Space

A space for tabling is provided where students can approach the mentors and representatives of your company. Here students are able to learn more about your company and what opportunities are offered. There is a **maximum limit of twelve (12) representatives** per company, and there can only be **five (5) representatives at the table.** Each company is given the respective amount of tables and must bring their own tablecloth and materials.

Tech Workshop/Talk

A **60-minute time slot** (with 15 minutes of padding to set up/pack up) where you can host a workshop or talk of your choice. A room for the workshop/talk will be designated to the company by the time of the event.

Sponsor Lounge

There will be a multi-purpose room available for all sponsors throughout the event. This room can be used to decompress, store items, hold interviews with hackers, and other activities that sponsors would like to conduct.

Company Office Hours

A time slot where you, a sponsor, can communicate with students aside from the career fair. Sessions can be run during this time. Some good themed sessions would be: resume critique sessions, one-on-one Recruiter/Sponsor Q&A/info sessions, etc. *Time slots will most likely be staggered to avoid congestion and confusion.

Challenge & Side-Event

A challenge is a more technical and competitive problem offered by a company, while a sideevent is a more relaxed and fun event. When hosting either, **it is required to provide a prize to participants.**

Knight Hacks will provide updates as the event nears and will immediately advise all participants and sponsors if any changes arise.
